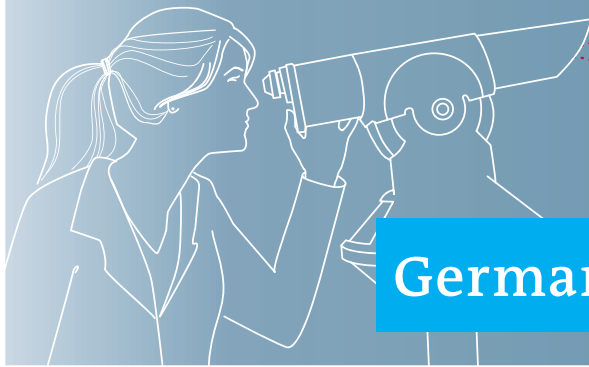

## Germany: Making or Breaking Europe?
