

Dr. Emily Goldman is Director of the US Cyber Command / National Security Agency Combined Action Group. She previously served as Deputy Director for Interagency Coordination, Office of Communication, USCENTCOM; Strategic Communication Advisor to the Coordinator for Counterterrorism, U.S. Department of State; and Associate Director, Support to Public Diplomacy, U.S. Department of Defense. She received her PhD from Stanford University and was Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of California, Davis from 1989 to 2008. She has published on strategic, military, and arms control policy; military innovation; revolution in military affairs; organizational change; and defense resource allocation. She has received awards and fellowships from the MacArthur, Olin, Pew and Smith Richardson Foundations, and the U.S. Institute of Peace, the Woodrow Wilson Center and the U.S. Naval War College. Her book, *Power in Uncertain Times: Strategy in the Fog of Peace*, was published by Stanford University Press in 2011. In 2012 she launched the Cyber Analogies Project to develop analogies to improve understanding of the cyber environment. *Cyber Analogies* was co-edited with John Arquilla and published by the Naval Postgraduate School in 2014.
